The American Embassy in Mali is pleased to announce the FY 2010 International Fulbright Science and Technology Program. Grantees will be enrolled for Ph.D. study at top U.S. universities in the fields of science, technology, or engineering. The International Fulbright Science and Technology Award is a worldwide program. Eligible fields include: aeronautics and astronomic/aeronautical engineering, astronomy/planetary sciences, biology, biomedical engineering, chemistry, computer sciences/engineering, energy, engineering (electrical, chemical, civil, mechanical, ocean, and petroleum), environmental science/engineering, geology/earth and atmospheric sciences, information sciences/engineering, materials science/engineering, mathematics, neuroscience/brain and cognitive sciences, oceanography, and physics.

Eligibility:

- Applicants must be citizens of Mali
- Applicants will have completed an undergraduate degree before August 1, 2009
- Applicants must be proficient in English with a recent TOEFL score (or equivalent) of 580 or higher.
- Applicants must submit a GRE General Exam score report. A nominee is expected to achieve a quantitative score of at least 700. (Note, a GRE Subject Exam score report will also be needed for all selected candidates in the following fields of study: biology; biochemistry, cell, and molecular biology; chemistry; computer science; mathematics; and physics.)
